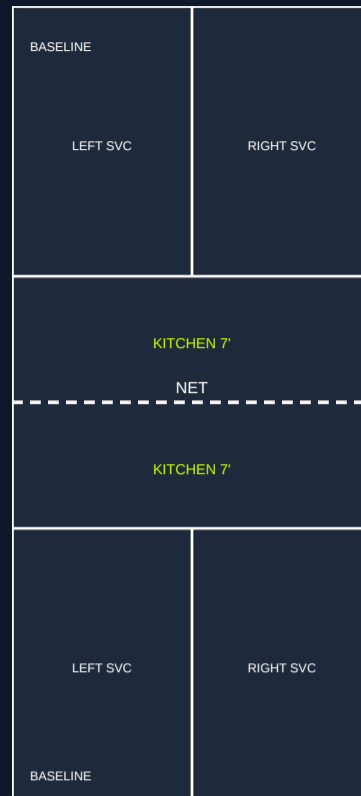


# Construction Checklist & Plan

## Step-by-Step Construction Checklist

- Check local permits & HOA rules
- Call 811 to mark underground utilities
- Measure & stake court area (30×60 ft recommended)
- Excavate 4-6 inches of topsoil
- Grade base with 0.5-1% slope for drainage
- Compact soil and install geotextile fabric
- Pour concrete slab (4"-5" thick) or compact gravel base
- Cure concrete for 28 days
- Apply acrylic surface coating (or lay modular tiles)
- Paint permanent lines (2" wide)
- Install net posts in concrete footers
- Set up fencing & gates
- Install LED lighting (if desired)
- Final inspection & clean-up

## Base & Surface Comparison

Base	Durability	Cost	DIY
Concrete (4" slab)	Highest	\$\$\$	Hard
Asphalt (3-4")	High	\$\$\$	Pro only
Gravel + tiles	Medium	\$\$	Easy

## Material Shopping List

- Geotextile fabric
- Crushed stone (for gravel base)
- Concrete or asphalt (if applicable)
- Acrylic resurfacer & color coats
- Line-marking paint or inlaid tape
- Permanent net posts & net system
- Chain-link fencing, gates, windscreen
- LED floodlights & poles (optional)
- Tools: compactor, trowel, stencils, measuring tape

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
